Location: 41 Flinders Tce, Wadlata Outback Centre

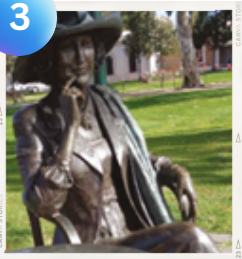
This metal sculpture is a tribute to Camels the ships of the desert in early pioneering times, who travelled across the region and outback.

Location: Marryatt Street (Public Library Exterior Wall)

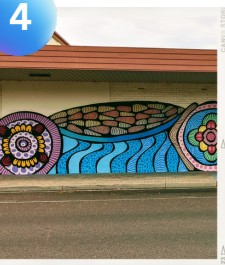
Titled "Tales of the Infinite" the mural is a vibrant collage of fantastical landscapes and characters that seamlessly blend into one another.

Artist Linda Klarfeld

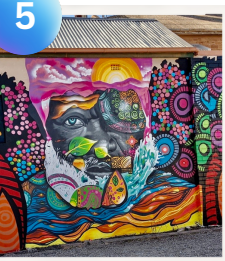
Location: Gladstone Square

This mural symbolises Port Augusta as a resting place. The two boomerangs, represent people returning. The flower is a symbol of hope and thriving. The blue hue is the Spencer Gulf. The two large orange circles represent outside places. The two purple circles represent people sitting with elders.
